

KRIPKENSTEIN

IT SHOULD BE borne in mind that *Philosophical Investigations*¹ is not a sysematic philosophical work where conclusions, once definately established need not be reargued. Rather the Invistigations is written as a perpetual dialectic, where persisting worries, expressed by the voice of the imaginary interlocutor, are never definatively silenced.²

Since the work is not presented in the form of a deductive argument with definative theses as conclusions, the same ground is covered repeatedly from the point of view of various special cases from different angles with the hope that the entire process will help the reader see the problems rightly.³
